Theme: Interrogating Evil: Responsive and critical engagements with Church, ideologies and personhood after July 22

In the context of Norway, the tragic events of July 22 opened up a portal to critically reflect on the nature of evil. Breivik's manifesto draws on a complex nexus of ideological positions, from Christocentric superiority to Odinistic ancestry/purity and Islamophobia to create his vision of a 'good' society. The roundtable seeks to explore the relationship between Christian ideologies and evil, as informed by the context of July 22, and, as a consequence, the demand for responsive and critical engagements in society as a whole. In particular, we would like the roundtable participants to provide some thoughts/critical reflections on (some of) the following questions:

- What can we learn from July 22 as it pertains to the nature of evil? And, does this bring to bear on the Church's self-understanding or the Christian ideologies embedded/embodied within the Church?
- What can be inferred about Breivik's perspectives vis-à-vis the hierarchies underlying contemporary Christian practices (e.g. liturgies, symbols, rituals)?
- What can we learn about human personhood and propensity for evil in the context of July 22? And, relatedly, with respect to societal dynamics (wherein Christian ideologies form a backdrop), how are notions of personhood configured in ways that is responsive to what it means to be fully human after July 22?
- What are the various ways in which 'we' can act with a critical and responsive voice in interrogating evil after July 22?

We would like each participant to prepare a **5 min** contribution. After participants have shared their contributions the chairs will facilitate a discussion based on the themes/issues raised, then we will open up for questions from the audience.
