### ATTR Mobility Grants 2022

To encourage the PhD fellows to spend time at top-level academic institutions, ATTR funds mobility grants for ATTR members at the member institutions. The board awards the grants based on the relevance of the host institution for the applicant's PhD project and its relation to the aims and profile of ATTR.

The 2022 travel grants cover shorter or longer visits (with a minimum duration of 3 weeks) at a research institution abroad. The visit must fall within the dissertation project period. **Each member may apply for up to NOK 50.000, and the total grant amount is NOK 150.000.** It is possible to apply for smaller sums, and for more than one grant period.

### Who can apply?

All members and PhD fellows at the ATTR member institutions can apply.

### Deadline

Deadline for the application is 1 March 2022

Deadline for spending the grant is 31 December 2022

### How to apply?

All applications must contain a research plan, confirmation letters from your host institution, supervisor and a specified budget. Please send your application with all relevant documentation to ATTR Administrative Coordinator Ina Marie Ausland at [i.m.ausland@teologi.uio.no](mailto:i.m.ausland@teologi.uio.no)

### Research plan

- Your application needs to include a **research plan** reflecting how your travel will promote your research into textual scholarship and your international networking.
- The research plan should show the **relevance of the host institution**, and your **planned activities there**, preferably also the name of your local contact / supervisor.
- The plan may also include details of your local involvement (e.g., supervision, paper presentation, courses, meetings, archival work, etc.)

### Confirmation letters

- A letter of **invitation** from the host institution or the host supervisor
- Your primary supervisor must confirm approval for the travel through a brief written statement of support.

## **Budget, original receipts and tax**

- Your application should include a simple budget for your travel expenses. The grant covers expenses directly related to your journey, such as costs for travel, housing, conference fees, etc. Indirect expenses like book purchase, clothes or insurance are not covered.
- Please note that additional expenses are tax liable.
- We are working on a procedure allowing for travel grants to be paid in advance, but the university economy system has not yet confirmed that this shall be possible.
- After your stay, please provide original receipts for all expenses and prepare an accounting overview
- If such documentation cannot be provided, the parts of the grant that has not been accounted for will be reported to the tax authorities as income.
